



ATTIC TRASH AND TREASURE DONATION GUIDELINES

1. Items we **DO NOT ACCEPT**:

- Mattresses and box springs
- Bed frames without headboards
- Large appliances
- Books
- Computers, printers, and copiers
- Filing cabinets
- Gun safes
- Children's clothing, toys, and beds
- Home renovation materials
- Household/Automotive chemicals
- PLEASE NOTE: In the past, we did not accept used medical equipment. However, one of our members is collecting these materials for St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) and will transport them from our Storage site to SVdP.
- 2. ALL donations must be packaged appropriately. This means that boxes should be filled, closed, and taped shut so that they can be easily stacked. The only materials that do not have to be boxed are lamps, larger furniture/gardening items, sporting equipment, and "soft goods," such as clothing and linens. Soft goods can be tied Heavy Duty garbage bags. PLEASE do not use large contractor's bags.
- 3. If you arrive at The Storage Center and your donations are not appropriately packaged, you will be given the necessary materials, and you will be asked to re-pack your donations so that we can easily store them.
- 4. Thank you for your assistance as we work to make the most judicious use of our storage space, which keeps our expenses as low possible in order to turn over more profits to our Nonprofit Recipients.



2025-2026 GLOBAL GRANT SCHOLARSHIPS

Applications for 2025-26 Rotary Global Grant Scholarships valued at \$35,000 each are now being accepted for one year of graduate study abroad among qualified applicants.



Any Rotary Club in Rotary District 6200 is eligible to submit one or more candidates by or before Monday, Oct. 21, 2024.

The opportunity requires study after the July 1, 2025 start of next Rotary year within one of Rotary's seven areas of focus:

- · Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- · Disease prevention and treatment
- · Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- · Economic and community development
- Supporting the environment

Desired country, university, study field and anticipated budget are required on the application and District Committee interviews anticipated in November/December.

Interested clubs and students are urged to contact District Scholarships Chair Donna Landry for more information and guidance. She and former or current scholars can also be available for related club presentations.
